



STATEMENT OF FAITH

As grateful citizens of Western societies, we believe it is our sacred duty to reclaim societal ground lost to ideological extremism and reinforce Judeo-Christian values, namely:

1. The Sanctity of Life

Human life is sacred because it is created in the image of God (Genesis 1:27). This underpins opposition to murder, cruelty, and unjust harm, and supports compassion, care for the sick, and protection of the vulnerable.

2. Love of God, and Love of Neighbor as Yourself

Jesus, as well as Rabbi Hillel and other Jewish sages, identified these as the greatest commandments (Deuteronomy 6:5; Leviticus 19:18; Matthew 22:37–40). They express devotion to God and compassionate concern for others, forming the moral core of both Judaism and Christianity.

3. Individual Freedom

Everyone deserves the right to make personal choices free from coercion or manipulative distortion of their consequences. This liberty inherently carries the responsibility to respect the equal rights and differing beliefs of others, even when they directly oppose our own.

4. Justice and Rule of Law

Justice (mishpat) and righteousness (tzedek) are central in both Jewish and Christian ethics (Micah 6:8; Matthew 23:23). They call for fairness, honesty, impartial courts, and defense of the poor and oppressed.

5. Moral Responsibility and Stewardship

Humans are moral agents responsible for their actions (Deuteronomy 30:19, Romans 14:12). This entails personal accountability, repentance, and ethical choice rather than fatalism.
